Pipeline Program to Promote Academic Diversity (P³AD) – three-year academic enrichment and mentorship program for students and residents designed to increase diversity of faculty at UConn Health and affiliate institutions

MDelta curriculum – major curricular reform effort undertaken over a two-year period using team based learning (TBL) as the primary pedagogy. Specific contributions include:
