- Plan and schedule oversight hearings; these include hearings on the Administration's response to Covid-19; content moderation and Section 230; online platform oversight with the CEOs of Facebook and Twitter; Net Neutrality; broadband deployment and affordability; 5G and spectrum policy; the Sprint - T-Mobile Merger; media marketplace diversity and minority media ownership; robocalls; and supply chain security.
- The Subcommittee is responsible for oversight of the Federal Communications Commission, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration, and the Emergency Communications Division in the Department of Homeland Security.
- The Subcommittee's jurisdiction includes broadband, wireless, cable, satellite, radio, television, mass media, and emergency communications technologies; spectrum policy, cybersecurity, digital privacy, data security, Net Neutrality, 5G, and Section 230 of the Communication Decency Act.
